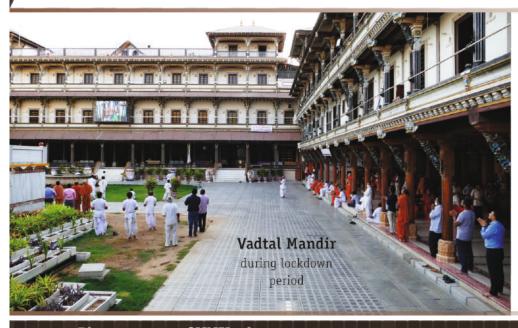

Prelude

Vachnamrut is Para-vani of Lord Swaminarayan. It contains all the quintessential secrets of all the Vedas. Lord Swaminarayan delivered holy sermons of Vachnamrut in simple language to the followers of His time. The followers of His time had great faith for Lord Swaminarayan. That helped them to understand the message of their beloved God, delivered in those Vachnamrut. They realised one thing that the Lord of infinite universe had taken birth as a human being, and living as a human being among them, showered the wisdom to them which is now known as Vachnamrut.

Lord Swaminarayan has expressed His message explicitly in many Vachnamruts. The message may be about Incarnation - Incarnator (avtar-avatari) or about Upasana or about five religious vows (Pach Vratmans) to be followed by the disciples or about the code of conduct for the followers. Lord Swaminarayan has emphesized more on humble devotion. Lord Swaminarayan said that He would not like an egoistic person. Shreeji Maharaj said that the lustful person would spend his time in one corner and fulfill his goal of devotion. But the egoistic person would never survive in the Holy fellowship. Lord Swaminarayan has expressed many such elements in these discourses.

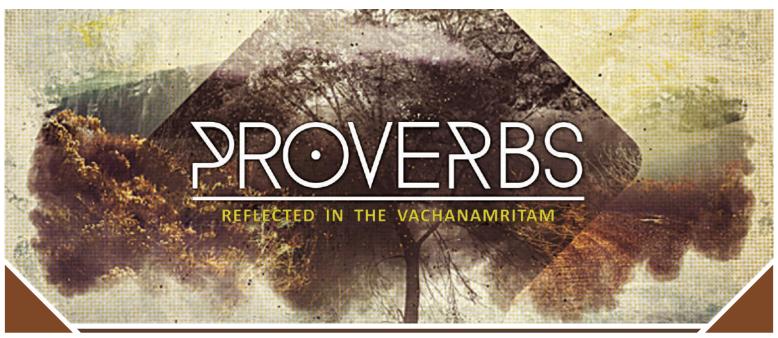
Our main goal is to take the message of Vachnamruts to the large people. It should be conveyed through any medium. We strongly believe that publishing various kind of literature can flourish our Holy Fellowship. Only Dev, the temple, five times Aarti etc. may not help us to flourish the Holy Fellowship. We strongly believe that the propagation of the Sat-shastras

of the Fellowship can strengthen the faith for all time. The holy scriptures of the Swaminarayan Fellowship are: Shikshpatri, Vachnamrut, Satsangijeevan and Bhaktachintamani. Lord Swaminarayan Himself wrote Shikshpatri. The followers read it everyday. Satsangijeevan is a scripture which is understood by the scholars only. Nishkulanand Swami wrote Bhaktachintamani in a traditional style so that the common followers understand it easily. While Vachnamrut is a collection of the discourses of the Lord.

Out of these four scriptures, the Vachnamrut is a compilation of discourses delivered and authenticated by Lord Swaminarayan Himself. Whenever we talk about Vachnamrut, we have not to say anything new. We do not interpret in our own way. We merely follow it. We follow the message of the Lord in its true sense. If we do this, we get the result. Otherwise everything is worldly. And if we want to safeguard this treasure of our Holy Fellowship, we will have to make our Satsangis wise. The wise will be jitendriya (a person having control over his senses); the wise will not be cowed down by anybody, he will not be influenced by anyone. But the person having the worldly passions will care for all worldly things like who attended his function, how many of them are influential and who are not. Even the end result is also worldly. Nothing is done to please the Lord. Those who tread on the path of the Lord, achieve the true happiness.

Vachnamrut is the root of our Sampraday. So all should read it. Those who read daily follow their Lord. Those who do not read should make a point to read it once in a year. Even one reading may enable him to understand one tenth of our Shri Hari. That will provide him the guts for this Holy Faith. This will build one generation.



GADHADA MIDDLE CHAPTER - 35



Man Changa to Katharot me Ganga

IF MIND IS FIT AND FINE ONE CAN SEE GANGA
IN THE KATHAROT (large deep dish)



In Vach. Gadhada Madhya – 35 the Lord cites this Gujarati proverb which is based on the power of mental and psychological satisfaction of man. If a man is mentally satisfied he feels sated in every walk of life. But the Lord explains that this proverb is not true for the real ascetic. He says that he had overslept in the previous night and had the Darshan of Ramanand Swami. He could see himself, the Swami and the soul distinct and clear. Such vision can be available only after many births of profound devotion of Lord Krishna. One should not expect to see the soul without devotional meditation. It becomes possible after the recitation, chanting, kirtan of God's name. Welfare of the soul can be achieved through following realization and doing Kirtan. This path of welfare is as easy as crossing the ocean by a boat. Welfare of the soul through contemplation is like crossing the ocean by tying big dry gourds under the arms. Atma-jnan, realization of the soul is a more difficult path than the path of devotional worship. If a person believes the soul as separate from the body he would not cherish attachment for the body, and will not cultivate attachment for the relatives of the body and therefore he will not experience any barrier or obstacle on the path of devotion. One should not believe that clean conscience is the only means of welfare. This proverb of 'FIT AND FINE MIND CLEAN CONSCIENCE' is not true as far as welfare of the soul is concerned. E.g If a person has achieved welfare by spiritual progress either by (1) realizing soul or (2) by devotional worship. But if that fellow starts to be associated with female he loses all his spiritual power. And if a female has achieved spiritual height and if she starts to be associated with male she too loses all spiritual powers. If a fellow becomes Brahmachari or Paramhansa with clean, fit, fine mind, may it be male or female but remains within the limits of religion may it be Satsangi, household, ascetic male or female total adherence to religious rules keeps him worthy of welfare. E.g. may it be daughter, mother, or sister, but if you avoid her company when she is alone, that can keep you worthy, fit and fine for welfare of the soul. Here the explains the secret of spiritual devotion by specifically describing four pillars of devotion. These are: (1) Worship the form (idol) of God. (2) Doing Kirtan-listening of the sports of God during His incarnations. (3) Chanting the name of God. (4)

Doing routine worship by getting Darshan of idols in the temples consecrated by me. Remembering Samaiya-gathering organized by us. Remembering our sermons, talks and our worship by devotees. If a person contemplates on the above four or any one of them at the time of death his soul surely attains the abode of God. When these four aspects are consolidated in the mind one can achieve total real welfare soul-realization. Without these four aspects will be like crossing the ocean by tying gourds which is insecure and risky.

Langhanam Fasting

If you want physical, mental, emotional and spiritual health, you should practice 4 langhanams.

4 langhanams for spiritual power

Our ancients in India used one very simple principle. They called it "Langhanam Paramaushadam", fasting is the ultimate medicine. I want you all to wait, before you come to any conclusions. I want you all to listen to the end. If you want mental, emotional, spiritual and physical health, you should practice 4 langhanams.

The first langhanam is fasting food. Our ancients did not see the human body as an eating machine. Funnily so many people in seclusion are engaging in nonstop eating. This kind of eating will only make you more sick and is going to make you more prone to infections. Eat only when your digestive fire actually burns and asks for it, not when your tongue asks. That will also give some break to whoever is cooking at home. Start eating only when your breath is flowing strongly through your right nostril; you can digest what you are eating most effectively when the breath is flowing through your right nostril because of the solar energy flow.

Practice any kind of fasting —You can practice intermittent fasting, water fasting or soup fasting. Remember, even animals fast when they are sick or want to heal themselves. Langhanam can also be eating right. All immunoglobulins, which are

antibodies to fight diseases are all proteins. Eating right will mean taking the right amount of protein into your diet to enhance immunity.

The second langhanam is fasting breath. Just as the more heat an engine produces the faster it burns out. Every cell is like an engine that is being powered by the intake of breath. The ancient yogis practised fasting of breath. They deliberately did slow inhalations and extremely long exhalations with breath pauses. When you practice breath fasting, you will actually age slowly. Your thoughts begin to become more positive. You can more easily break away from negative thinking.

The third langhanam is fasting hurtful and pessimistic speech. Very few people have Vak-Shakti or the power of speech to manifest their goals. The more consciously you speak words that are true and cause joy to others in a very pleasing tone, your Vak Shakti grows.

The final langhanam is fasting movement. It's not about living down on your cushion, eating popcorn and watching TV. Fasting movement means sitting still, either observing your breath, listening to the sounds of nature or with the name of your divine being chanting inwardly. Sit still, even if you can sit still, even for 1 minute at a time, it will bring down the restlessness in your body, it will bring down the restlessness in your mind. Langhanam or fasting is power.

Try practicing these 4 langhanams and you will feel great power in your body, in your mind and consciousness.

The gist of all scriptures of the Sanatan Dharma in local language which is very easy to understand for any beginner.

A unique presentation of the sermons offers trend-setting standards of editing and compilation. Perhaps the first scripture in local vernacular prose.

The first para of every chapter is rarity: time, date, day, audience, place, the dias of the Lord and description of the dress and costumes and even the emotions of the Lord are mentioned meticulously, found for the first time in literature.

The first scripture having a short but useful biographical note on the life and work of the Lord by the compilers.

The Lord personally supervised the

compilation work and authorised the editors to circulate the first manuscript and it's copies. The hand-written manuscripts are available with saints and in the temple collection.

The scripture begins with the Partharo (preface) and ends with Hudo - a summary of the scripture in Sanskrit verses.

Shukanand Swami, one of the four compilers, was the first to give heading to all the sermons.

The Swaminarayan Mandir, Vadtal brought out the first printed edition of the Vachnamrut in V. S. 1933, A.D. 1877.

The Ashadhi Samvat is mentioned in the Vachnamrut.

In Vachanamrut, Bhagawan Shree Swaminarayan is referred to as Swami Shree Sahajanandji Maharaj 154 times and Shreeji Maharaj as 108 times in the first paras of Vachanamrut.

Shreeji Maharaj delivered 184 sermons at Gadhada, 18 at Sarangpur, 12 at Kariani, 18 at Loya, 7 at Panchala, 20 at Vadtal and 3 at Amdavad.

The Vachnamrut contains 456 questions; of which Sahajanand Swami asked 138 questions while 318 were asked by saints, Satsangis and scholars.

The Lord dictated one letter to Shuk Muni at Bhakti Bag in Gadhada which is included as the Khagol-Bhugol Vachnamrut at the end of the scripture.

The 25 sermon of Gadhada Antya has one and the only question from a woman disciple Rajbai.

Sermon Gadhada Madhya 19 ends in the form of a letter.

Answers to the questions of curious seekers

Lalji Bhagat | Jnang Bag - Vadtal



We try to search God in a temple, but how much time do we spend in the temple? We spend major part of our time outdoors because life today has become full of hustle, bustle and competition. Modern man lives under stress and strain. Earning money and earning bread has made life full of mental and physical struggle. In the evening, he returns home with tired mind and body, retaining the impressions and negative vibrations of routine life. It becomes necessary that he gets a place (in his own house), which may prove a recluse reposit for him that offer him solitude and calm.

This reposit means the room for Pooja of Lord Swaminarayan in our house. "If I have experienced or achieved something good or benevolent, the reason behind it is my beloved God." With this kind of feeling, we should sit before the idol to thank Lord Swaminarayan. If something bad or wrong has happened, we should pray to the idol to suggest remedies, ways and means to overcome the problem. So this Pooja-room has direct relation with our inner mind.

We generally notice that wealthy people spend profuse money in decorating drawing rooms and

bathrooms, but even 10% of that amount is not spared for the Pooja-room. Some houses do not have Pooja-room. Sometimes, such small temple is adjusted in the space underneath the staircase or in the kitchen reserving minimum space for God's home temple.

The happy and well-to-do Satsangis - household devotees should spare a separate room for God and it should be decorated in such style that it may inspire sacred and positive thoughts. The Simhasan of Lord Swaminarayan should be set on a platform of marble, granite or wood with artistic get up. Devotees living average life should spare (though small) decent space for Shriji Maharaj. In that space, the picture image i.e. Moorti approved and recommended by Shriji Maharaj should be placed in Simhasan, and no other things should be put. People stuff the temple with so many things that they buy when they go to a pilgrimage. We feel trouble in concentrating on the idol while turning beads, offering Manasi Pooja or Dhyan. We should keep in the Simhasan only that form which has been approved by Shriji Maharaj and do its worship, Prayer and Aarti. If this, routine is maintained in the house, that house becomes as sacred as the temple!

There is a method of adorning God with dignity. Some people spread an old newspaper and put the Moorti on it. Some people put the Moorti in a nitch and streams of oil and ghee keep running down. This creates a dirty impression. The Pooja room should be clean, neat, quiet and sacred. There are many benefits of having Pooja room in the house. When children get ready after bath, we should send them to Pooja room. Cultivate such habit in them that they should bow to the Moorti and chant Swaminarayan Mantra, read Shikshapatri and when they grow up, they should perform Nitya Pooja and then start routine work. Such habit built up from childhood can inspire best culture in the future. If possible, all the family members should assemble in Pooja room for evening prayer and should sing Aarti, Kirtan, Dhun and Prayer. If



this is not possible it can be done in group on holidays or Vrat-festivals.

Separate utensils should be used for offering Thaal-prasad (offering food plate) to Shriji Maharaj. When Diwali comes, we buy new clothes etc. but the garments of the idol remain the same which were brought from Vadtal. The curtains for God should be changed. Woollen mattress, shawl and woolen curtains should be arranged for God during winter. Proper lighting, fan or a.c. should be arranged for God as per one's financial condition.

The Ghar Mandir should be decorated as per the mood and spirit of different festivals and food plate should be offered to God. When there is birthday celebration in the family, a sweet dish should be offered to the idol and Bhajan-Dhun and special worship should be arranged on such days. In some families, grand birthday parties with rich dinner take place but neither Pooja nor Prasad is offered to the Moorti of Lord Swaminarayan. This is not fair.

By remembering Lord Swaminarayan and

offering Prasadi food to the idol (in the Ghar Mandir), sacred vibrations rise in the hearts of family members. The differences are minimized and there prevails peace and plenty in the family.

The atmosphere of the temple is competent to make positive effect on the mind. When we are back home after routine business or tour, we should wash our hands and feet and then visit the Pooja room where we should sit before the Moorti for some time. When we go out, we should first have Darshan of the Moorti in the Simhasan. We should keep a coin-box in the Pooja room and when we do Darshan, we should put affordable amount of money in it. The amount collected in this box should be offered in the temple (constructed by the order and approval) of Shriji Maharaj in your area.

In this way, we have seen how Pooja room should be arranged and decorated. If Nitya Pooja (daily worship) Aarti, Thaal, Kirtan, sermon reading and listening are done in true spirit, our house can turn into a temple.



Health Spirituality

Immunity

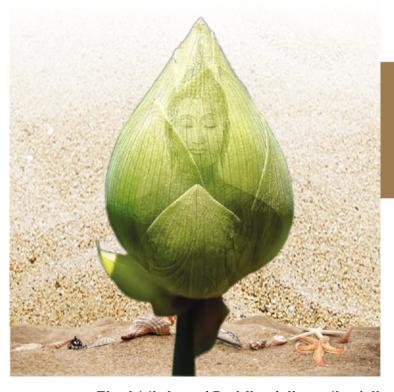
Immunity means the natural body mechanism through which our body protects itself from various diseases. According to Ayurveda there are many factors which contribute to our immunity. One of such things is the "Oja".

According to Ayurveda there are 7 basic body tissues which form the human body and all the functional systems of the body, these are; Rasa (Nutritive Fluid), Rakta (Blood), Mamsa (Muscles), Meda (Lipids), Asthi (Bones), Maja (Marrow) and Shukra (Reproductive cells). These are known as the "Sapta-Dhatu". The essence of these 7 tissues is known as "Oja". And if this Oja is in a balanced state and functioning properly you won't have any disease. So, many consider this Oja as the Immunity. But as you know that this oja is the Essence of all 7 Dhatus (Tissues) we need to understand that there can't be anything which will directly increase your immunity. So, Immunity of the human body according to Ayurveda is developed when you keep all the Body tissues and systems in a balanced state. You can understand it in this way: that even if only one of your 7 dhatus is not proper then your immunity won't be proper.

This Immunity is also described as "Bala" of an individual i.e. strength. Bala according to Ayurveda is of 3 types: Sahaja (Congenital {Since Birth}), Kalaj (Depending on Time {Season, Age}) etc. and Yukti Krut (Acquired). The Sahaja Bala is inherited and we see that many people are not affected by few diseases naturally due to their DNA or chromosomes hereditarily. Kalaja Bala depends on many factors like the persons age: Children are more

prone to certain diseases like chicken pox or polio because it can occur during that age group only, we also say that young people are more immune to many diseases and so they can recover fast from illnesses. Kalaja Bala also depends on season and climate: We are more prone to certain diseases in certain seasons (eg. We see the outbreak of Dengue or Virus related diseases during the rainy season or more attacks of Asthma during the Sharad Ritu). Our health is in better condition during Youth, spring and early morning compared to Old Age, Summers and evening. Yukti Krut Bala represents acquired immunity (eg. Durign the times of epidemics of Viral and flu diseases like the present CoVid-19 outbreak we advise to take Tulsi juice, Turmeric Milk and Ayurvedic decoctions to prevent the diseases from entering our body).

So for overall improvement of Immunity as I said at the start only having some herbs or medicines won't help but you will have to improve the overall status of your body by following Seasonal Regimen (Ritucharya), Daily Routine, (Dinharya) Achar Rasyana (Moral code of conduct), eating wholesomeeasy to digest-compatible food, daily exercise-yoga-pranayama-prayers, and having herbs and medicines like Rasyana's which are suitable to you depending on your age, season and epidemic conditions.



BUDDHa

Part - 1

The Brahman tradition echoes the auspicious voice of our Vedic religion and the Buddha and Jain religious traditions can be considered as the sweet fruits of the Shaman tradition.

The Vedic culture and tradition were caught in canker (by termite) at the time of the arrival of Buddha and Jain faiths. Lacs of innocent animals were being killed in the name of religious sacrifices. The Ashram tradition in the Varnashram (caste based) system was beneficial. But personality was being objectified. Under the excuse of caste-difference the people belonging to lower caste were being exploited politically, economically, socially and also religiously. Blind faith and blind beliefs took the place of religion in major walks of life.

Lord Buddha and Bhagawan Mahavir returned to lead people on the worthy and sacred path during this dark and dismal period. If Lord Buddha can be entitled as the incarnation of compassion Bhagawan Mahavir can be regarded as the incarnation of non-violence. Both of them belonged to a royal Kshatriya dynasty and were visionaries. Both of them were curious to take religion and knowledge to the common man. Both of them had gained the bliss of Nirvana during their

The birthday of Buddha falls on the full moon day of Vaishakh month in the Hindu calendar. It is the day to attain Buddhahood and Maha Nirvana (total liberation).

What a great coincidence! The full moon day of Vaishakh month is the day to attain Buddhahood and also the day of attaining great liberation through awakening or enlightenment of the soul. It happens to be the birthday of Shri Buddha. Many great personalities had taken birth in the 6th century B.C. and in the same 6th century Lord Shri Buddha and the 23rd Tirthankar of Jain religion i.e. Shri Mahavir in India, Lao tse tung in China. Hiraculatus and veteran mathematician Pythagoras in Greece and such other gems of mankind were born. Also Jerthoost was born in Iran in the same century. The anatomy of Indian culture and civilization has constituted mainly by two great, fabulous and chaste traditions - (1) The Brahmana tradition and (2) Shaman tradition.

life span and had achieved, the right goal of their lives.

When violence which was considered as exceptional became essential and permanent routine Buddha incarnated himself. The poet Jaydev (in Buddha Charitam) says that it was Vishnu who had assumed the body of Buddha. The feeling of pity for animals was being feeble and values of human life were being destroyed. Animals on earth had lost their right to continue life on this earth. The fulfillment of the animals right to live and its materialization in the real sense means Lord Buddha. He can be called 'an epitome of the of the values related with non-violence. Such incarnation evolves itself in view of the expectations of the universe as at the individual level.

The name of the father of Lord Buddha was Shuddhodhan who had been a ruling king in the Shakya branch of Kshatriya royal dynasty. The name of his mother was Mahamaya. While going from Kapilvastu to Lumbini Mahamaya caught delivery pain right in the mid-way, and there she delivered this amazing great child. The group returned to Kapilvastu very soon. Mother Mahamaya left this world on the 7th day from giving birth to child Buddha. He was given the name Siddhartha.

As their Gotra (family root) was Gautam so the child was also called 'Gautama'. An astrologer had warned King Shuddhodhan, "This bright child of yours will assume renunciation and will become an ascetic in future."

Kind Shuddhodhan never wished that the heir and successor to the throne of Shakya dynasty should become an ascetic instead of becoming ruling emperor of large kingdom. How can this be avoided and how can this prophecy be disproved? Then he approached the astrologer to find some effective way to avoid the future unwelcoming situation, the astrologer replied, "It is likely that Siddharth may become ascetic if he happens to watch the scene and know about birth, death and old age."

Therefore it is advisable to keep him away from the pain and agony of material human life. The knowledge of worldly pains may drag him towards asceticism.

Kind Shuddhodhan tried every means to keep his child remaining quite aloof from all the pains of worldly life, and he ordered to keep the young prince confined to the walls of the palace. Also he managed to make available all types of comforts, facilities, the teachers and impart expected education to the prince inside the palace. As the prince grew up in age and knowledge he imbibed the concepts and skills regarding the subjects politics, practical management, economics and horse riding, sword fight, wrestling, etc. But the questions related to his existence created an upheaval in his mind, and he remained restive as he could not find the solutions of the torturing questions. In fact he lived thousands of kilometers away from the relatives of the body and all the means of worldly happiness. He was Kshatriya by caste and hunting should have been in his blood, but he believed that it was his religion and moral duty to protect living beings.

Trust Him to take care of the things you cannot.

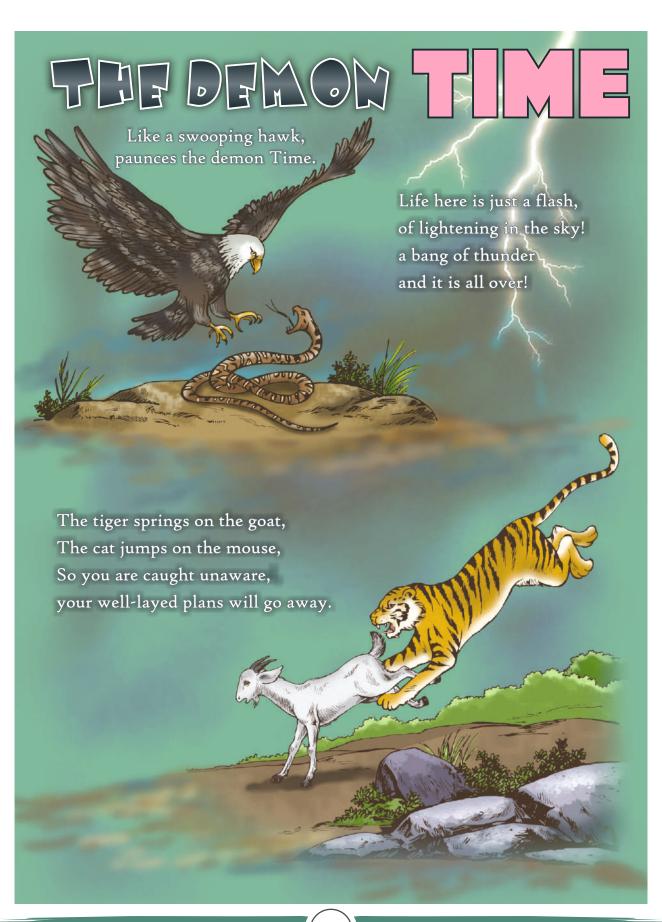


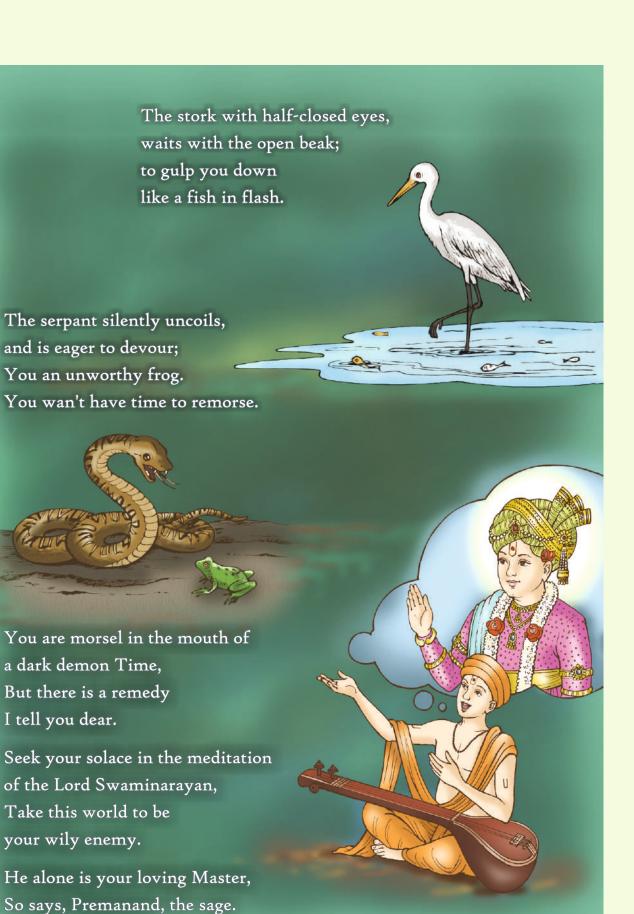

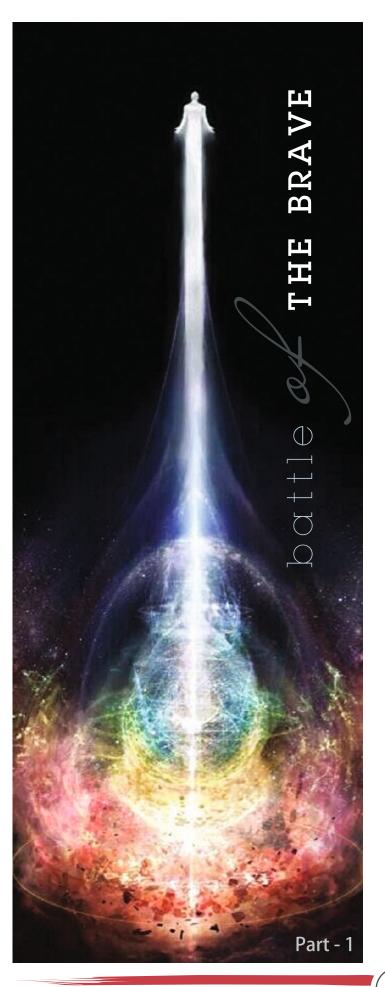
Guru is the one who removes the ignorance by shining the light of knowledge: Gu (darkness) Ru (remover). Guru has traditionally

The saintly person has to fight more bravely even than the brave. None dares fight with the mind - says the great saint Muktanand.

In this world an individual fights with another individual, a family fights with another family and a country fights with another country. Thus fighting is the normal process of the mind, because the mind does not compromise between the two groups. So, let us think about the mind in this article.

As a matter of fact, what is mind? Mind is the storekeeper of our astral body which is the storehouse of all our good and evil inclinations and thoughts. Mind is the cause of death as well as the spiritual liberation. The difference springs out from the method of its utilization.

An individual or a country that defeats another individual or a country is said to be brave from materialistic viewpoint, but real bravery does not lie in that. The real brave individual is he who, after fighting with the mind leads it stage by stage on the path of spiritual progress.

There is an exceptional point that the God Who is ever-attained, who is present, Who is never separate from us, appears distant to us. And the world that never ever stayed with us, will not stay with us, which cannot stay with us, which always remains distant from us, that world appears to be acquired and close.

This is the main point. God is not One Who is present at times and not present other times. qqGod is not One Who is in some place and not in other places. He is not one Who belongs to some and not to others.

Such a One, is not called God.

One Who is there is some situations and not in other situations is not God. Who is present in some incidents, and not in others is not called God. Who is present in some actions and not in others, is not called God.

One Who is in all, belongs to all, Who is ever present, yet you say that He is far away. The world which does not stay with anyone, will not stay with anyone, will not last even for a split of second, and which is constantly perishing, yet you say that it is attained.

That which is not present, you believe it to be present, whereas that which is present, you believe it to be not-present. You believe it does not exist. That which IS. You believe it is not, and that which isn't there, you believe it is.

The reason for this is 'that which is not ours' we regard it as ours, and That which is ours, we do not consider it to be ours. This is the main work that needs to get done.

Now you think about this point that, is

this ours all the time? Was it always ours? so what is meant by always ours?

It means ~ Whosoever was with us earlier, is with us now, and later on will remain with us, Who can never separate from us, and we cannot separate from the One. Who is all capable, yet is incapable of separating from us. And we are incapable of separating from the One.

That One (He) is Mine and I am His. Let us say He who stays with us all the time, without interruption, is unable to ever separate from us, is totally incapable of doing so, that One (He) is Mine.

He who is sometimes mine and other times not, somewhere mine, and somewhere not, in some situations mine, and in some situations not mine, at certain times mine, and at certain times, not mine,

That is not mine.

Today you have received these things, this family, whatever you have received, will it stay with you? Experience ! and see for your self! That which you get and later departs from you, is in fact not yours at all. You assume that you had it, therefore you say that it has gone away, but did you really have it? And you constantly remain in the form of Existent Element.

Whereas that is unreal (transient, non-existent)! But by accepting that you had it, therefore now its separation is taking place. It is disuniting from you.

Whereas separation from God can never take place. We have an eternal union with God. And we are eternally separate from the world. That which is always separate, is not ours. From a gross perspective, that which is separating from us, is not ours, whereas which never separates from us, is ours.

aith is the foundation of all religions of the world. Faith begins where all reasoning ends. Faith can move mountains but mountains cannot move faith. You have faith because you have faith. Thus faith is both the cause and the effect.

Faith is inherent in men. It cannot be forced or superimposed. Faith cannot be changed. At the golden Temple of Sikhs at Amritsar, there is a sculpture which shows a man whose head is being sawed by a jigsaw and underneath it is written: 'Even if my head is cut into two pieces, I will not give up my faith.'

You have faith in Godhood of Bhagwan Shree Swaminarayan. So even if you are offered all the treasures of the world or full authority over the whole

world, you will not exchange your faith for the same.

The boy who stood on the burning deck when all but he had fled, in the poem Casablanca had faith that his father would certainly come to save him as he had asked him to stay there till he came.

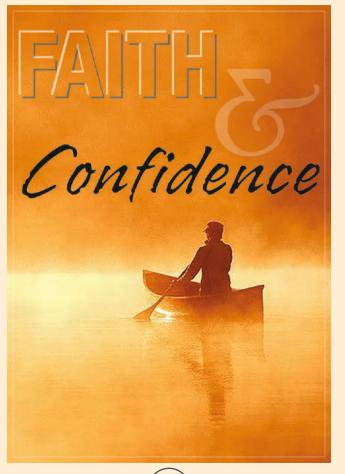
When a great sinner came to the Saviour for pardon, the latter gave him a dry log and asked him to plant and water it and promised the pardon of all his sins when the log would sprout. He did so, much to the laughter of all. But because of his faith the log sprouted all

of a sudden after many years!

Utkarsha Muni was a student of the great sage Agastya. When the learning was completed after 14 years, he said to his Guru: 'Ask for anything as your fees.'

Agastya Muni said: 'Show me God before my eyes and that would be the fees.'

Utkarsha Muni had heard that Lord Rama had come to the



forest-Dandakaranya. So, he at once rushed to Dandakaranya shouting there: 'O Lord Rama, please come to me. I want to show you to my Guru!'

But search for God is not so easy. His legs bled profusely because of injuries caused by sharp stones. He received innumerable cuts and bruises on his body by thorns. Hunger tried to harass him and thirst tried to thwart his efforts. Ferocious animals threatened to kill him and cobras tried to swallow him. He went on calling for Shree Rama who took piety upon him at last and appeared before him.

Utkarsha Muni practically dragged Him to Agastya Muni and said : 'Here is God in person. Have Darshan to your heart's contentment.'

Shree Rama was pleased with the faith of Utkarsha Muni and said: 'Ask for a boon.'

Utkarsha Muni said: 'My Lord, I want you to stay in my hermitage as long as you have to live in the forest.'
