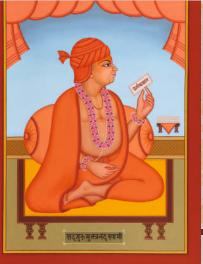

Muktanand Swami possessed pure character; he was sweet and effective in delivering religious discourse, he was a very good orator of Ramkatha. He was also a good dancer. Besides this, he was a very good singer, a nadi-Vaid. His Sampradaayik literature is very profound; all these characteristics was the result of the grace of the Lord.

Nilkanth Varni met Muktanand Swami at Loj and got a satisfactory answer of his question about Jiva, Ishvar, Maya, Brahm and Parbrahman. Muktanand Swami was honest enough to confess that the answer was the result of the teaching of his guru, Ramanand Swami. So, Nilkanth Varni decided to stay at the Ashram till the arrival of Ramanand Swami. Muktanand Swami gave him a new name Sarjudas. The relationship of young Nilkanth Varni and the mentor Muktanand Swami has become a memorable chapter of the history of Swaminarayan Sampraday.

Lord Swaminarayan in Vachnamrut Sarangpur 3 opined that 'I had seen Muktanand Swami for the first time at Lojpur. Ever since then his faith and realisation of the glory of God have always remained fresh...' This is how He evaluated Muktanand Swami years after his first meeting at Loj. In Vachnamrut Gadhada Antya 27, He says,' At first, by nature I used to remain totally detached but wanted to have Darshan of Ramanand Swami. So I obeyed the instructions of Muktanand Swami but I did nothing that my mind liked.'

Yet, Nilkanth Varni was bold enough to suggest Muktanand Swami to conceal a hole in the wall kept to accept the coal from the adjoining house as it symbolises a hole in the life of saintlihood! Nilkanth Varni also asked to discontinue the practise of combined holy meetings of men and women, which also Muktanand Swami accepted. Inspite of this, Nilkanth Varni obeyed every instruction regarding manual labour of the hermitage. Muktanand Swami was the Mahant of the hermitage while Nilkanth Varni was a neophite there. The virtues like courtesy, understanding, obedience and the need of the Satsang prevailed in Muktanand Swami.

Once Muktanand Swami and Nilkanth Varni went out of the Ashram for meditation. Muktanand Swami was having a newly coloured Tumbadi with him and he feared that lest any bird vitiate it. Nilkanth Varni understood the conflict of Muktanand Swami as he was the Purna Purushottam. So, Nilkanth Varni said to Muktanand Swami, 'Swami! Dhyan - meditation is more important than the Tumbadi. 'Muktanand Swami accepted the rebuke without any grudge as both had a strong bondage of friendship.

Likewise, Muktanand Swami also expressed whatever he felt to Sahjand Swami. Once, Muktanand Swami was in in Kuchchha for Satsang and Sahajanand Swami was moving around Sorath with the movement of Samadhi Prakran. Muktanand Swami did not like the movement. He came back from Kuchchha and met Sahjanand Swami at Kalvani. He firmly said to Sahjanand Swami, 'Maharaj! Diyo pakhand meli, Satsang ma n thavu feli; Samadhi nathi kai soyali , e to mota mota yogine pan doyali; e to jene tene kem thay? Bija maane pan amne n manaay. 'Muktanand Swami said, 'O Maharaj! Give up the Pakhand, an irreligious and pretentious activity. Please, do not

be feli, irresponsible; Samadhi is not easy, even the big Yogis find it difficult to achieve; and how can that happen to everybody? Others may believe it but we will not. 'Muktanand Swami had this courage to say to the Acharya of Uddhav Sampraday because they had mutual respect for each other. When Muktanand Swami realised the fact of the Samadhi Prakran, he immediately wrote a lyric - Jay Sadguru Swami... which later on became the Arti of the Swaminarayan Sampraday.

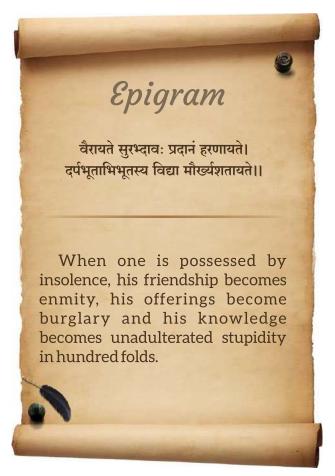
Once, Sahjanand Swami asked Muktanand Swami to go to the court of Gayakvad at Baroda for shashtrarth, religious debate. He went and presented his case successfully. He said, Sahjanand Swami is Sarvopari and He Himself is Purna Purushottamnarayan. He proved this by quoting references from the scriptures of Sanatan Dharma. This proud of Swaminarayan Sampraday is the result of the true knowledge of Uddhav Sampraday and pure character of Muktanand Swami.

Moreover, in Surat, Muktanand Swami successfully sent the ghosts of a haunted houses of a street to Badrikashram but never performed any miracle as he lived the life of a true saint. He made the people of Surat the followers of Swaminarayan Sampraday. Once in Amdavad an opponent mixed poison in the sandal wood paste and applied it on the forehead of Muktanand Swami. Muktanand Swami suffered a lot because of that poison but followed the traditions of Sampraday faithfully.

Sahjanand Swami once asked Muktanand Swami, 'Swamiji! You should write the life story of your Ishtdev. You should narrate about His nature, character, message, Dharma and His glory in religious books because such literature would strengthen the Sampraday in future. So, till the last breathe of your life, you should write books, granths, kirtans of your sampradaya. 'Muktanand Swami followed the command of his Ishtdev. The result was a vast horde of literature. Muktanand Swami wrote 30 volumes which is published in a collection called 'Muktanand Kavya' and his Kirtans are published in 'Kirtan Muktaharam.' Muktanand Swami wrote in Sanskrit and Prakrit languages in prose and poetry. He even worked as one of the four compilers of Vachnamrut.

Muktanand Swami wrote as per the command of Sahjanand Swami and that is why Sahjanand Swami remembers Muktanand Swami in Vachnamrut, Satsangijivan and Shikshapatri often.

Sahjanand Swami once said, '... If there are bad feelings and thoughts in your mind, then the chanting of Muktanand Swami, would clear all the bad feelings immediately. Such is the power of Muktanand Swami. Shri Hari always praised Muktanand Swami, respected Muktanand Swami, consulted Muktanand Swami and always considered him as a real Sant. Thus, Lord Swaminarayan has praised Muktanand Swami in various ways; but, this is only a glimpse of innumerable qualities possessed by Muktanand Swami. That is why he was considered the Mother of the Satsang. We should listen to his life story, ponder over it, and try to follow some of his virtues. If that is done, it is also the worship of the Lord.

In response to the earnest prayers of Uddhavji the Lord appeared there and gave him darshan. By looking at the appearance of the Lord the devotee felt pleased by heart.

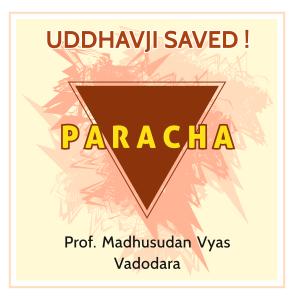

Learn three cardinal virtues: Damah means self-restraint, Daanam means charity and Daya means compassion for all life.

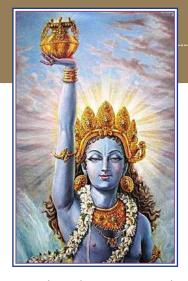
The trees teach us these three virtues.

Food Habit

Ayurveda - The Science of Code of conduct for Healthy Body, Mind and Spirit

Why do some individuals consuming wholesome food get afflicted with diseases, while some individuals consuming unwholesome food remain healthy? In this regard, how does one infer that health and disease are influenced by wholesome and unwholesome foods respectively?"

An individual consuming wholesome food will not get afflicted with disease due to the food. Intake of wholesome food alone is not the causative factor for a disease or can prevent diseases. Apart from unwholesome food, there are many other etiological factors that lead to a disease, such as changes in season, intellectual errors, unwholesome contacts, excessive, wrong and over-utilization of senses of sound, touch, vision, taste and smell. These etiological factors can cause diseases in an individual despite wholesome intake of tastes (Rasa) and diet. Hence, an individual taking wholesome food has also been observed to have taken ill.

Similarly, consuming unwholesome diet does not immediately produce untoward effects. All unwholesome food articles are not equally harmful, all the Doshas are not of equal strength, and all the bodies are not capable of preventing disease. Unwholesome food can be more harmful depending upon the habitat, season, combination, potency, and intake in excessive quantity.

The Dosha become acute and extremely difficult to manage when they get associated with multiple factors, treated with wrong therapies, become deep rooted, chronic, get vitiated in one of the ten seats of Prana, and when they afflict vital

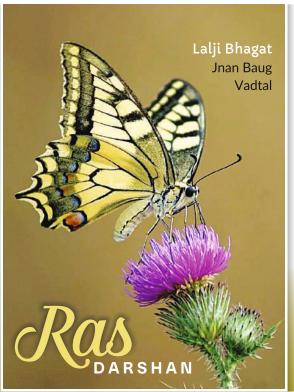
centers within the body known as marma.

Individuals, who are excessively obese, emaciated, whose muscles, blood, bones are depleted, who are physically very weak, who are habituated to consuming unwholesome food, who take in inadequate quantities of food, and who have very weak mind cannot withstand diseases. Contrary to this, individuals having opposite qualities to the ones mentioned above are capable of resisting diseases. Thus, unwholesome diet, dosha, and body constitution factors produce diseases

These vitiated dosha stay in the peripheral regions in a dormant state and do not cause any diseases till the season or environment is conducive for them to act. The dosha wait for other favorable provocative factors in the form of the region, season, etc. to cause diseases

An intelligent individual follows an effective regimen after a thorough evaluation of the diseases and its etiological factors as well as his Prakriti. An individual dominated by Rajas and Tamas mental faculty, on the other hand, follows a regimen that could be pleasant to his senses, without any consideration or evaluation of his condition, the treatment, and his constitution. An intelligent person possesses the qualities of obedience, intelligence, memory, stable, able, purity of speech, tranquility, courage, and follows a wholesome regimen. Ignorant individuals do not possess these qualities as their mind is enveloped in Moha (attachments to possessions) and Rajas. Hence they suffer from various physical and mental disorders.

When Ekadashi comes use the mobile during the day only when it is inevitable. This is called fasting in the real sense. It is a different kind of fast. The method of fasting changes with the change of time. As modern instruments appear in upgraded new models, we have to upgrade our body by introducing new changes. The method is like this – First catch the ninth day of bright half of every month, then Ekadashi and then full-moonday – avoid touching mobile on these days. Then if you make your instinct introvert you will see the changes that take place within you. If you put your hand in a bag full of coal it will turn black. In the same way, if you touch mobile all wrong elements will come with it. That is the reason why you should keep mobile-fasting.

So where addictions never enters and lustful desire and anger never tread, Lord Swaminarayan resides there. If you believe that you follow five Vratamanas everyday so you have no addictions but the addiction of mobile is dangerous and very hard to avoid. You have to drive out this addiction from within. Mobile is more dangerous than playing cards. In playing cards the risk is limited but mobile will throw so many bad things in your conscience and you will not be able to recognize it. It will drag you and throw you into a ditch. It will spread disorder in your mind and then you will

say, 'I cannot visualise God during Mansi Puja'. How can you see God? You cannot see God because mobile has thrown plenty of garbage in your conscience.

This point of mobile addiction should be well understood by us. You may not be drinking wine, you may be a good devotee, you may not eat food or drink even water outside of your house but mobile addiction is more harmful than eating or drinking outside the house. Something eaten or drunk is disposed on the next day but if this thing enters your daily life it will trouble you for the rest of life. One who learns control in life can save himself from this addiction. One who wants to live close to God should decide 'I will use the mobile for this much time in a day'. Then if somebody tells you to dial a number you will say, 'I will do it tomorrow'. If you develop such discipline in life most of the troubles will go away, and your mind will be inclined towards chanting Mantra of Lord Swaminarayan and meditating upon Him.

It is our normal practice that we use to recite in Cheshta before going to bed that "The Lord is resting on the bed of love, Muktanand sings the praise of His lotus-feet round the clock, Shyam, the dear one of all the munis goes to sleep." Then

say goodbye and request Shriji Maharaj to return to His place and say now I will continue my activity. If your activity continues it will not allow the Moorti of God to be stable in your mind. So all should decide 'We will use mobile during the day only when it is utmost necessary' and in this way you should reduce the duration of using the mobile. You can use it for 2 or 3 hours per day and then leave it aside. If you can do this, good thoughts will enter your mind and your conscience will become pure. In Kaliyuga everything is mechanical so the type of addiction has also changed. So you should understand the mobile as the most dangerous addiction and try to save yourself from it. Then wrong thoughts will not enter your mind and any wrong action will not be done by you and if wrong things are not done God will remain near you.

This mobile has put life in every house on fire. Almost 15 people in the family may have gathered at any occasion but each of them will be busy with playing mobile game, checking messages, watching news. A single person is not interested in the other person. So this mobile does not allow family members to come closer to each other. For this reason your family life is disturbed and disrupted. If you study it deeply you will see that this is the worst kind of addiction. If you have the addiction of mobile you have to put cross on it. If you keep the addiction then believe in your mind for certain that 'there is a distance of 12 kilometer between me and Shriji Maharaj'. You have to forget that 'I will sit for Dhyan or I will sit for Mansi'. As long as you keep the addiction with you, Lord Swaminarayan will not make entry in your conscience. Lord Swaminarayan resides at the place where addictions never enter.

MOBILE, the most dangerous addiction that keeps us away from our nearest and dearest ones and beloved God.

he cradle of the civilizations like Egypt and Babylon and other great civilization of the world was set on the bank of great rivers.

Indian civilization also developed in the Indus valley, which is a part of the great Indus (Sindhu) river.

The epigram "Water is (The elixir of) life is one of the greatest gifts to the world civilization by the Indian civilization. Indian culture and civilization create a balance between the emotional and rational aspect of human life.

It teaches every person to love entire mankind instead of being self-centered. Apart from it our civilization teaches us to extend our love to animals, trees and plants. Indian civilization encourages the reverence for self, for fellowomen for the universe at large. Indian philosophy is very sacred, because it believes in slogans "Let sacred thought come to us from all directions." This point has been explained by Lord Krishna through the medium of the chapter on Vibhuti Yoga of Bhagavat Gita.

In the ancient time our Rishis had attained oneness with the universe and with trees and entire vegetation they had learnt the lessons of life by identifying themselves with the inanimate world. They watered the plants, trees and creepers by believing them as their own brothers and sisters.

The Deodar tree which is believed as his own son by Shivji had been watered and nourished by Parvatiji. And it has been beautifully described by the great poet Kalidasa in Raghuvamsham. "Parvatiji, the mother of Kartikeya has irrigated this Deodar trees with the nectar like milk from her breasts as it is believed to be her own son by Shivji". When Kautsa the young disciple of Maharshi Vartantu goes to the world winning yajna performing Raghu, the

king asks about the good health of Arana trees: "I think that the trees in the Ashram which give shade, shelter and comfort to men have not been injured."

This incident proves that in that time trees were considered as important as human beings. When Shakuntala, the foster

daughter of Maharshi Kanva is watering the plants her friend Ansuya says, "These trees are dearer to father Kanva then yourself. For that reason he has asked you to water the plants." Then Shakuntala replied with affection, "I am watering the plants not because father Kanva has ordered me, but because I love the trees and plants like brothers and sisters.

The fourth verses spoken by Kanva Rishi in the forth chapter of Abhijnan Shakuntalam written by supreme Sanskrit poet Kalidas contain essence of the entire drama, and this one belongs to that group of verses. In this verse, Kanva Rishi asks the trees in the hermitage t o bid farewell to Shakuntala who is departing for the house of her in-laws.



"O Dear trees! That Shakuntala who never drank water before irrigating it to you, though she is fond of beauty and make-up she never picked a leaf from your branch and who believes your first flowering as a festival is going to the house of her in-laws so all of you bless her by bidding farewell".

Our ancestors worshipped the Ashvattha tree for its herbal medical qualities and regarded it as the representative of the entire vegetational

world. They visualized God in the Pipal tree and sang prayers to it is in fact a part of their sacred vision. As per the vision of our ancestors the Pipal tree symbolizes "The form of Brahma at its root, the form of Vishnu at the middle and the form of Shiva at its top".

Lord Shree Krishna in Vibhuti chapter of Bhagavat Gita says, "Pipal tree is another form of Mine". The ladies of Hindu society also worship Pipal tree on some occasions and pray to it to grant long life of their husbands. They observe Vatsavitri Vrata to ask for stability in life.

They ask for the competence and capacity to get back their husband from Yama as it was done by Savitri. Also they ask for long life of

their husband like the life of the Banyan tree. They ask for peace and patience for their family like the patience of a Banyan tree. Also they ask for the expansion of the family like the branches of a Banyan tree.

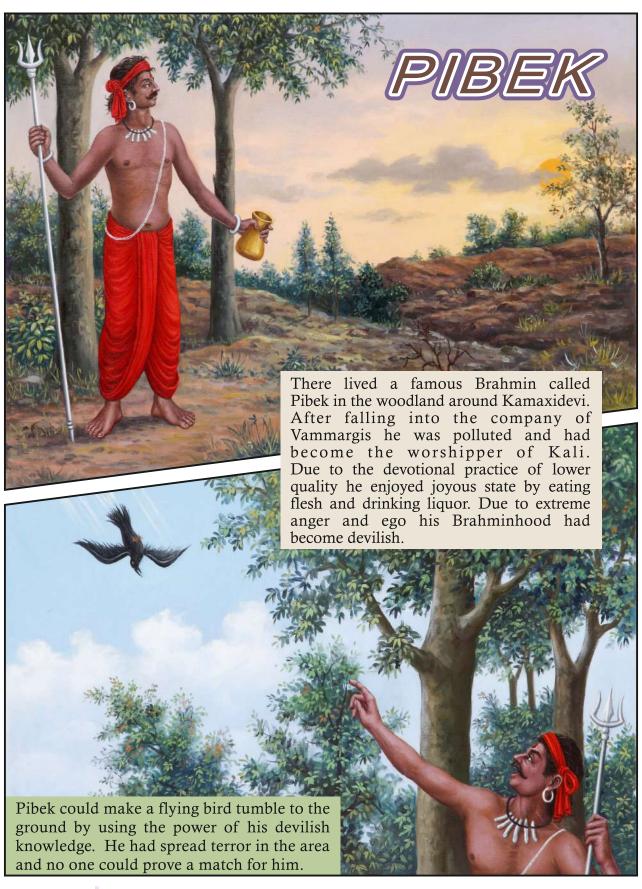
What is truth after all? Non-violence, peace are its complimentary aspects. If our truthful speech creates agitation, violence, restlessness, it is not the truth we are speaking.

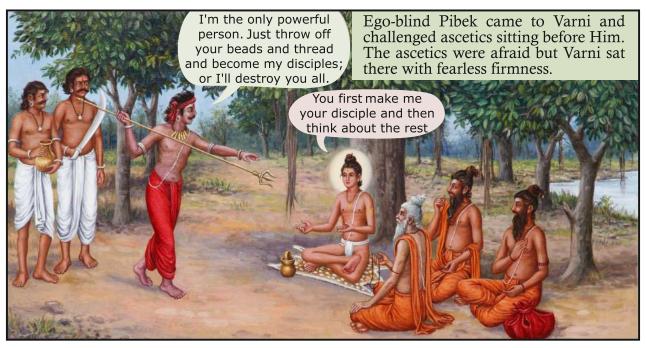

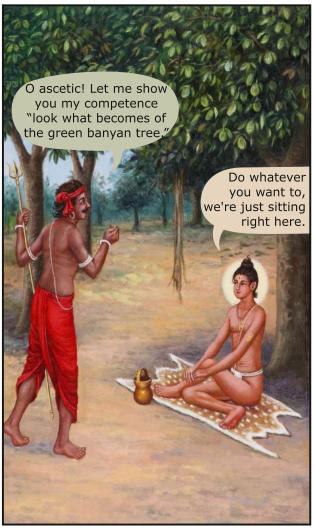

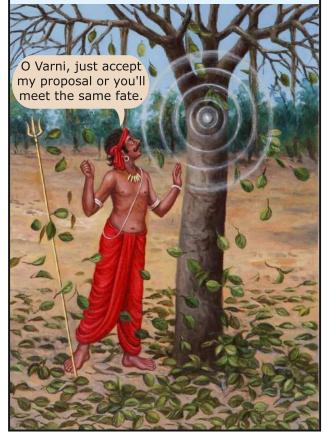
The speech that promotes happiness, peace, security, non-violence in life is called the true speech.



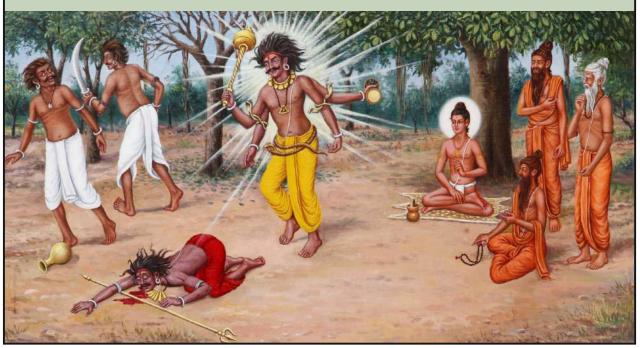


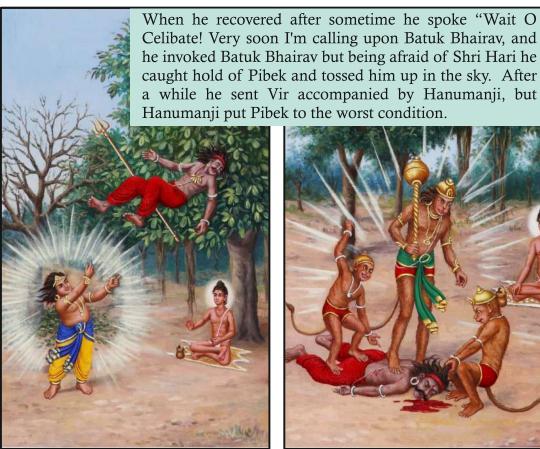


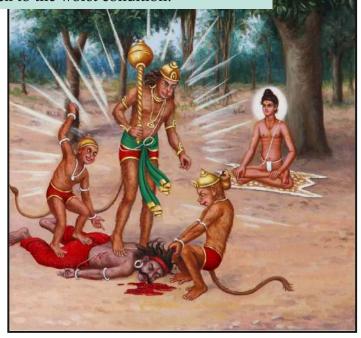

Holy Basil (Ocimum Sanctum)

The plant has delicate lavender colored flowers and its fruit consists of tiny rust colored nuts.

Tulsi is a potent herb that has been used in India for thousands of years mainly for divine protection and medicinal benefits.

It is a form of Basil and is also called the Holy Basil.

Holy basil is a sacred plant in Hindu belief. Hindus regard it as an earthly manifestation of the goddess Tulsi, a consort of the god Vishnu. The offering of its leaves is mandatory in ritualistic worship of Vishnu and his forms like Krishna and Vithoba.

A traditional prayer tells that the creator god Brahma resides in its branches, all Hindu pilgrimage centres reside in its roots, the Ganges flows through its roots, all deities in its stem and its leaves and the Hindu scriptures – the Vedas in the upper part of its branches.

While tree worship is not uncommon in Hinduism, the Tulsi plant is regarded the holiest of all plants. The Tulsi plant is regarded as a threshold point between heaven and earth. "The manifestation of god in the vegetable kingdom"

Tulsi has spiritual as well as medicinal significance in Ayurveda. Many Indian families keep a living Tulsi plant in their homes tending to it with great care and reverence.

Tulsi is also important because of its amazing medicinal properties.

According to Ayurveda, tulsi promotes purity and lightness in the body, cleansing the respiratory tract of toxins and relieving digestive gas and bloating.

1. Healing Power

The tulsi plant has many medicinal properties. The leaves are a nerve tonic and also sharpen memory.

2. Respiratory Disorder

The herb is useful in the treatment of respiratory system disorder. A decoction of the leaves, with honey and ginger is an effective remedy for bronchitis, asthma, influenza, fever, cough and common cold.

3. Sore Throat

Water boiled with basil leaves can be taken as drink in case of sore throat. It can also be used as a gargle.

4. Stress

Basil leaves are regarded as an 'adaptogen' or antistress agent. Even healthy persons can chew 12 leaves of basil, twice a day, to prevent stress. It purifies blood and helps prevent several common ailments.

The plant's woody stalks are often made into beads used in meditation malas or rosaries.

And for Mouth Infections, Insect Bites, Skin Disorders, Teeth health, Headaches, Eyes Disorders, Children's Ailments, Heart Disorders, Kidney Stones, and many more health problems.

Sadguru Gopalanand Swami, during the Gayakwad rule, happened to stay in Vadodara. Those were the days when Vadodara was known as the city of Pundits. Hence Shriji Maharaj wished that Gopalanand Swami would stay in Vadodara in the interest of the Satsang. He was the most proper choice to convince all of the fact that Shriji Maharaj was none other than God Almighty Himself in the human form. Moreover Gopalanand Swami himself was very pious and enlightened saint. With the grace of Lord Swaminarayan he could perform miraculous deeds for the welfare of the Satsangis.

There was a poor boy called Mangal who used to come to the temple to render little services. Swamiji found him to be a good boy. He took pity on him and allowed him to put him at his association. 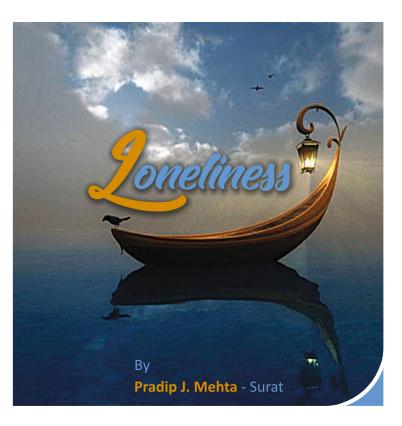

There could not be a question of any loneliness or solitude as you can open any chapter happened in past or happening in present or likely to happen in future or contemplate to make such event or chapter, which could help you to pull-out from the loneliness felt.

Loneliness is never silent, it is more eloquent, expressive and productive. When you are alone and away from the company and

crowd, your mind is more concentrated and focused; hence it exploits the creative character and becomes more innovative. Thoughts continue to rush on the subject under contemplation as you are alone and protected by the solitude. Loneliness helps to the chain of continuity of thoughts and more than that it filters the process of thinking, which helps to the logical perfection of derivations.

Never before, now and in future that a human being could be lonely as every human being has an inner self which is real and the other one is physical outer self. So everybody is conjoined with the real inner self and that never allows you to be lonely. The inner self/person keeps you alive; but unfortunately rare are those who realize the real person in our outer physical body and take the physical body as real person. The inner self is the real self. None of our actions or thoughts could escape from its notice. All acts and thoughts are evaluated, watched and scrutinized as to whether they are honest, genuine, righteous or corrupt, cruel, villainous or wicked. Thus inner master is always present till last breath is inhaled, so you are never lonely.

Loneliness could be physical and mental. Physical loneliness eventuate or crop-up when you are missing friends and family members' associations. Physical loneliness could be a cause of the mental loneliness. Mental loneliness can result if your sentiments are not properly responded or totally not responded. Human mind is a storage of various kinds of sentiments. Human mind is very emotional and hypersensitive too. Nilkanth Varni wrote perhaps the first letter of his life at Loj on the fifth of Falgun Vad, Vikram Samvat 1856. He addressed this letter to Ramanand Swami. Muktanand Swami, along with his letter, sent the letter of Nilkanth Varni to Ramanand Swami at Bhuj with Mayaram Bhatt.

The content of Nilkanth Varni's letter provides many points of his India pilgrimage.

I have come to this part of the country after finishing my pilgrimage in all the great centres with the will of God.

Here I heard that a Jivanmukta has manifested himself.

Besides when I was learning Yoga from Gopal Yogi living with him in a forest, and when I attained mastery over Ashtang Yoga, he told me that I would find a siddha in the shadow of Mount Girnar.

After that I passed many a day living only on air, but I could not see the Krishna Incarnate.

Now I have stayed here knowing this to be holy land.

Hearing from Swami Muktanand whom I look upon as a holy man and therefore as one who would tell the truth, that you give a vision of Krishna in Dharana.

I am eager to see you as a chakor is to see the moon, and so kindly come back soon, otherwise I shall come there.

He has too many great and noble qualities to be mentioned...

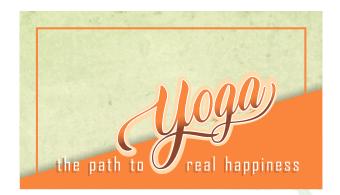

1. What Yoga Really Is?

Once Shatanand Muni asked Shree Hari: O Lord, I would like to learn Yoga with all constituents including Yama (restrictions) thoroughly from You as You are omniscient and worthy to be served by Yogis. Though, I have been successful in attaining Samadhi (superconscious state) through Your favour, I want to learn about the precedent spiritual practises which constitute Yoga and all their characteristics as described in Yoga texts, together with critical commentaries.

Shree Hari said:

O saintly sage, You have the best intellect and intelligence and that is why You are curious to learn about the true essence of Yoga. In this world there is no other practice for realizing the desired objective. Only Yoga can lead to the ultimate good.

Even for the saints the control of mind is very difficult. But for Yoga, such mental control cannot be attained. While practising Yoga, the practise for enlightenment and devotion becomes successful. So the nature of Yoga should be certainly learnt.

The science of Yoga was at first spread by Hiranya Garbha Muni (i.e. Brahma). Then Patanjali, the incarnation of the great cosmic serpent – Shesha Naga presented it systematically in the form of aphorisms. Accepting the essence of these aphorisms I narrate to you all the constituents of Yoga. All the constituents of Yoga are parts of Samadhi

in fact. Samadhi is said to be complete absorption of the mind in God Supreme - Lord Krishna (i.e. God). Now learn about the characteristics of the constituents of Yoga.

When metal ore is heated in the fire, all the impurities of a metal are destroyed. Similarly, by Samadhi Yoga all the impurities of the mind are destroyed. Therefore, the devoted aspirant should at once be enthusiastic and start the practice of Yoga for destroying all such impurities for attaining Samadhi for merging the mind into the Master of the Goddess Lakshmi (i.e. God).

The aspirant who desires success in all constituency of Yoga and Samadhi, should submit himself with devotion to the spiritual teacher who is the ocean of all arts of Yoga.

The aspirant should always serve him according to his linking. He should please him and practise Yoga in the way he says.

The aspirant of Yoga should live at a holy (unpolluted) place on the levelled land, free from pebbles and sand. The place must be pleasing to his mind and free from obstacles.

He should live at a place which is convenient for one who serves him with food and other provisions. He should live in a place where obstacles are not caused by cold, wind and insect-bites.

The devoted aspirant should live care-free in such a hermitage and practise Yoga. There he should have the convenience of a lake (or a river) fit for him.
